- It is the generation of writers which appeared after the World War II in between 1947-1963
- Beatnics were beat by life
- They didn't want any social values, money, job, wives, children
- They wanted to escape from the real world using drugs {alcohol, marijuana, morphine, LSD}
- They talked openly about homosexuality and bisexuality and free love
- The phrase "Beat Generation" was introduced by Jack Kerouac in 1948 anti-conformist youth movement in New York

- They liked jazz because of its improvisation, player plays what he feels, so the writers wanted to write what they felt
- They stood against conservative Americans and criticized their hypocritical lives
- But they were not able to offer any solution of the situation
- In the 60s they transformed into hippies


Famous members

Jack Kerouac

- Wrote the basic work of this time "ON THE ROAD"
- It is about a journey across America made by a young man Dean Moriarty and Salvatore "Sal" Paradise, it is based on the travels of Kerouac and his friends
- They are members of lower class and hate its traditional way of life
- They prefer jazz, alcohol, drugs, joyrides but they are alone and sad
- There is not any real plot

- The novel contains five parts, three of them describe road trips. The narrative takes place in the years 1947 to 1950 and describes a specific era in jazz history
- The novel is largely autobiographical, Sal presents the author and Dean stands for Neal Cassady, one of the major figures of the Beat Generation




Jack Kerouac




- He was born on March 12, 1922 and died on October 21, 1969
- He was an American novelist and poet
- He is appreciated for his spontaneous method of writing, covering topics such as Catholic spirituality, jazz, promiscuity, Buddhism, drugs, poverty, and travel

Lawrence Ferlinghetti



- He is an American poet, painter, liberal activist
- He is best known for A Coney Island of the Mind (1958), a collection of poems which has been translated into nine languages, with sales of over one million copies

- The collection consists of Ferlinghetti's most famous poems, such as:
- "I Am Waiting"
- "Junkman'sObbligato"
- "The World Is Wonderful place to be born to"
- It is one of the bestselling and most popular books of poetry which has ever



Allan Ginsberg



- He was strictly against militarism, economic materialism and sexual repression
- He supported illegal drugs
- Being a gay he fought for the rights of homosexuals
- He protested against the Vietnam war

Howl and Other Poems.

- Ginsberg's masterpiece
- Poem "Howl" /Kvílení/ is considered to be one of the great works of American literature
