
Anotace:



- He was born as
 Samuel Langhorne
 Clemens
 on November 30, 1835
 in Florida
- He became world-wide popular writing humor stories mostly based on his own life experiences

- He was born to a poor family where were 7 children but only 3 survived their childhood
- The family lived in a port town Hannibal on the Mississippi River that inspired him in his later literary works
- He became a printer's apprentice when he was 12 and he also worked as a typesetter and wrote articles to his brother's magazine




Mark Twain when he was fifteen

- At the age of 18 he left for New York where he worked as a printer a educated himself in public libraries
- When he came to New Orleans down the Mississippi, one steamboat pilot inspired him to become a pilot himself
- It was regarded very prestigious job
- This occupation gave him his pen name, Mark Twain, from "mark twain," the shouting when the river depth was two fathoms (dva sáhy)

Twain married OliviaLangdon in 1870 and theyhad 3 daughters



- He was awarded an honorary doctorate in letters in 1907 by Oxford University
- This is the gown for his degree



- He was appreciated mainly because of his humorous writing and social criticism and he was a master of colloquial speech
- First he wrote for Virginia City newspaper Territorial Enterprise
- "The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County" was his first important work

- He wrote a lot but many of his works stayed unfinished so it is difficult to count them
- His most popular and most successful works remain:
- The Adventures of Tom Sawyer
- The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn

THE ADVENTURES OF TOM SAWYER



- It is a story of a little boy Tom who lives with his aunt and his spoilt cousin.
- Tom and his friends Joe Harper and Huckleberry Finn live the life full of adventures which are very often funny but sometimes also very dangerous

- They see how Joe Indian kills a doctor but makes a trick that another man is sentenced
- They try to live on an island like pirates while the whole town believe they are drown
- They observe the discovering of a treasure by Joe Indian
- Tom and Becky, a girl Tom loves, lose in a cave, nobody can find them but meanwhile they can see where the treasure is being hidden
- Huck saves the life of a widow Douglas when he can hear Joe Indian talking about his plan to kill her

THE ADVENTURES OF HUCKLEBERRY FINN

- Fictional town resembles Hannibal
- Adventures take place on Mississippi river
- Huck Finn tells the story himself in colloquial language
- Compared to Tom Sawyer this novel is much more critical, there is very lively description of lives of people living along Mississippi

- Huck and his friend Jim, an runaway slave, travel by raft down the Mississippi river
- Huck doesn't want to stay with his father, alcoholic, and Jim runs away not to be sold
